To Whom it may concern,

As a PADI Instructor Trainer I have had the privilege of trying a lot of different scuba diving products. I would like you to know that the Pegasus Thruster is the best Diver Propulsion Vehicle (DPV) I have tried.

The design quality of the DPV is the best on the market. The hard case body is virtually indestructible. When using most DPV's, you pray that they don't flood. With the Pegasus Thruster, it's not even a concern. The ability to change the batteries or even take the DPV apart underwater is light years ahead of all the other manufacturers. It has great power to pull around 500 lbs. without any problems. Maybe the best part of this DPV is that it straps to the tank and can be hands-free.

The hands-free option is important to me because I also work with people with disabilities. To have a DPV which a person with a disability can use with little or no effort is huge for them. All the other DPVs throw their balance off because they have to hold the DPV with their hands. With Pegasus on their backs it keeps them streamlined and they are able to glide through the water. The easy on/off switch is also a plus. Everyone can use it. No matter what kind of disability a person has, they can work this switch by using their hands or by having it placed under their chin and using their chin to turn it on and off.

I have shown the Pegasus Thruster to divers and dive shops in the St. Louis area. If I had had the units on hand I know I could have sold 6-10 of the Thrusters. When I show it to others they all have the same reaction. "How do I get one?"

This product is so different and effective I know it will sell well once it is mass-produced. It's a must-have for the scuba diving enthusiast.
